The problem of righteousness

- Righteousness
 - A straight edge
 - Assessment
 - Relational
 - A characteristic of God Himself

- > A righteous life
 - Relationships v2
 - ► Generosity v3, 5
 - Justice v4, 5, 9, Lev 24:22
 - Resilience v6, 7

- Trying to live a righteous life ourselves
 - Luke 1:6, 2:25, Matthew 5:20
 - Difficult ... or impossible?
 - Psalm 14:1-3, 53:1-3, 5:9, Psalm 140:3, Psalm 10:7, Psalm 36:1, Romans 3:9-18

The source of righteousness

- Ps 111 and Psalm 112 are a pair, like Psalm 9&10 or 42&43
- ▶ The righteousness of Psalm 112 is God's own
- Imputed into the believer
- ► Hows
- There was one truly righteous person Mark 8:2, Matthew 9:36, Luke 13:11
- He demonstrated this righteousness in His life
- In death and resurrection He gave His righteousness to others
 2 Cor 8:9, 2 Cor 5:21

The nurture of righteousness

- 2 Peter 1:4 'partakers of divine glory', 2 Peter 1:3 'called by glory and virtue'
 - Now 1 Cor 6:19, Rom 8:29, Col 1:27
 - Not yet 1 John 3:2, 2 Cor 3:18
- Trust, v7, Psalm 40:4
 - His promises John 5:24, John 16:13, Isaiah 41:10, James 1:5
- Fear, 'not afraid' v7&8, 'fears the LORD', v1, Psalm 130:4
- Praise
 - Mental Psalm 111:2, the 'works of God' Psalm 40,5
 - Emotional 'delights greatly' v1,
 - Obedient Psalm 147:11, 19f
 - Corporate 'PRAISE the LORD' v1, Psalm 95:1 'let US sing'
